### MINUTES – December 8, 2025

Supr. Zaug called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. in Room 111 of the Fox Valley Technical College – Waupaca Campus and gave the open meeting statement.

**Roll Call:** Co. Brd. Chair Morack, Supr. Wengelski, Will, Purchatzke and Zaug were present. A quorum was established.

**Others Present:** Diane Meulemans and Kristy Opperman.

**Agenda:** Supr. Morack moved and Supr. Will seconded the motion to approve the agenda.

**Minutes:** Supr. Wengelski moved and Supr. Purchatzke seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on November 10, 2025. Motion carried without a negative vote.

**Public Comment:** None

**Legislative Conference Attendance:** Supr. Morack addressed the costs of the conference. The discussion with the committee was on how to determine who is allowed to attend. Chapter 2 may need to be looked into for any limitations on who and how to make the determination. There was also discussion on being active as a committee to ask for support on legislative items from our representatives in the Senate and Assembly. Further discussion will take place at next month's meeting to make a determination.

**Corporation Counsel:** Diane Meulemans updated the committee on civil actions and zoning cases. She then gave an update to the committee on CHIPS and TPRs, Chapter 51 Commitments and Chapter 54/55 Guardianship and Protective Placements as well as updates on Chapter 51 Appellate cases. She also gave an update on in rem properties.

**Child Support:** Diane gave an update on performance reports for the previous month including staff performance. There was an update on the assignment of duties and the case load per agent in the department. The two teams will include an Enforcement Team and Paternity and Establishment Team. Diane also informed the committee that she will be making a decision on one from her candidate pool to offer the open position too. The start date will be January 12<sup>th</sup>.

Will seconded the motion to agree that the committee has reviewed the annual evaluation, found it satisfactory and recommends the appropriate step increase for compensation. Roll Call Vote: Supr. **RESOLUTION NO. 36 (2025-2026)**  
TO AMEND WAUPACA COUNTY  
ORDINANCE NO. 45 OF THE GENERAL CODE OF ORDINANCES  
COMPREHENSIVE PLAN MAP

The County Board of Supervisors of Waupaca County, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Statutes 66.1001 authorizes Waupaca County to adopt and amend a comprehensive plan map, and

WHEREAS, Waupaca County has adopted written procedures designed to foster public participation at every stage of the comprehensive plan amendment process as required by section 66.1001(4)(a), Wisconsin Statutes, and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Committee held a public hearing on January 8, 2026 for amendments to the Preferred Land Use Map:

PLUM-001-2026: The Town of Helvetia, to amend the preferred land use category of a parcel located in the SE ¼ of the NW ¼ and part of a parcel located in the SE ¼ of the NW ¼ of Section 21, lying along Brevik Road and Carper Road, Fire Number E3493, Waupaca County, Wisconsin (parcel 08-21-24-1 and prt parcel 08-21-24-2), from Forestry to Residential to accommodate a proposed boundary line adjustment.

WHEREAS, the attached comprehensive plan amendment was approved and deemed to be consistent with the overall planning goals and objectives by the respective township of origin.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED that the Waupaca County Board of Supervisors adopts an Ordinance amending the Comprehensive Plan Map as originally adopted in Ordinance #45 and has been from time to time amended as follows: See attached documents

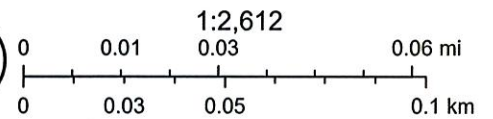

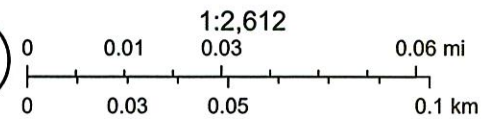
