Re: May 2026 Monthly Report

- At the time you read this, Captain Dennis Schroeder will have worked his last shift for the Clintonville Police Department. He truly has served this community with honor, integrity, and compassion. I am pleased to announce that, after a promotional process, Matthew Wright, who serves as a Sergeant in our department, was recommended and approved by the PFC to be the next Captain. Matthew will take over the Captain position on June 5th. I believe Matthew will do very well in his new position. He knows he has big shoes to fill, and I am confident he will acclimate to this position.
- In the next few weeks, we will be doing interviews to fill the open sergeant position that is now vacant due to Sgt. Wright's promotion.
- Last week, we placed an ad for a Full-Time patrol Officer position, with the anticipation of an officer being promoted to sergeant. At this time, we have received four applications. The deadline to submit an application and resume is June 19th.
- Officer Carter McPherson, who was hired in February as a part-time officer is nearing his field training.
- We are currently doing a background investigation on an individual for a part-time clerk dispatcher. Two of our part-time dispatchers just completed their two-year degrees in criminal justice and will soon be hired at departments for full-time officer positions.
- As most of you have seen, our permanent speed board has been placed on S. Main St. I sincerely thank the streets department for putting it up quickly. Officers and I have been monitoring the area to check on the effectiveness of the sign. We have noticed it is getting the attention of the motoring public and slowing vehicles down.

Attached to this report is an explanation from Sgt. Kizewski on the data that was collected. In reviewing 9 days of data, the average speed is 36 mph. We have the speed programmed to flash at 37 mph, which then indicates in the data that anything over 37 mph is considered excessive. Given the number of vehicles captured in the excessive-speed category, the average speed of those vehicles was 42 mph. This sign is set up in a posted 35 mph zone and will begin collecting data from vehicles south of the sign's location, in the area of the Clintonville Motel. Overall, in the small snapshot of data, I believe this has been effective. We will continue monitoring the data monthly.

- Officers continue conducting ordinance violations proactively or responding to complaints being called in. To give you the update on the property on Stewart St. that everyone is aware of, the court process has been completed. As you may recall, we wrote several citations for ordinance violations. Next, the city went through an abatement process last fall, but it has been stalled in court. That has now been closed. Last week, officers served the owner with ordinance violations and are hoping for voluntary compliance; if not, we will begin issuing citations again.
- We will be hosting our Cops and Bobbers event on June 19th. We had to cap the number of kids to 30. We are very excited to spend time with the kids and build positive relationships.
- Our golf outing is on August 7th. If you are interested in golfing, teams are filling up fast. You can sign up on our website.

The Stalker Speed Sign has been installed on S Main Street in front of the Fire and Iron Gathering building, in efforts to monitor speeds on S Main Street. The sign is in the posted 35 MPH, with the belief that it will help slow the northbound traffic down prior to entering the posted 25 MPH zone. Due to that reasoning, we have the excessive speed set to 37 MPH, which will cause the sign to flash when it reads a speed greater than 37 MPH.

The sign has been operating continuously since May 18th, and on May 27th, I was able to retrieve the data of the speeds in that area during that time frame. The detailed data is attached in a document.

To summarize the data, the average speed registered during that time frame was 36 mph, and the 85th percentile speed (of those that were above the 37 MPH excessive speed), was 42 MPH.

This data was pleasant to see as the average was only 1 MPH over the speed limit, and the average excessive speed was only 7 MPH over the posted speed. We will continue to monitor the data from the speed sign, and if an issue of excessive speed becomes a problem, the time frames in which the speeds are greater will be provided within this data.

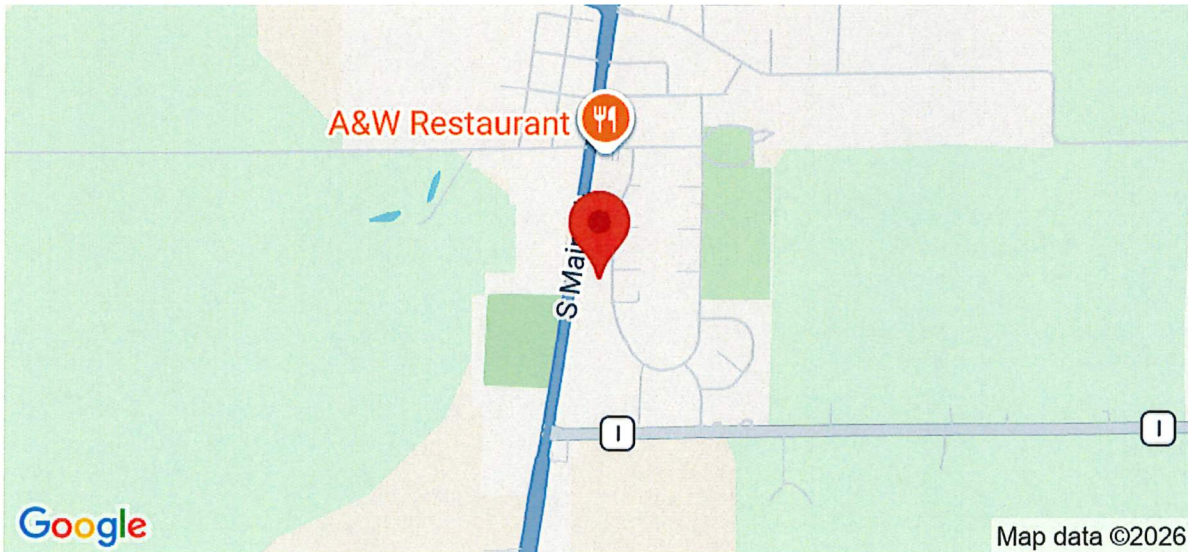

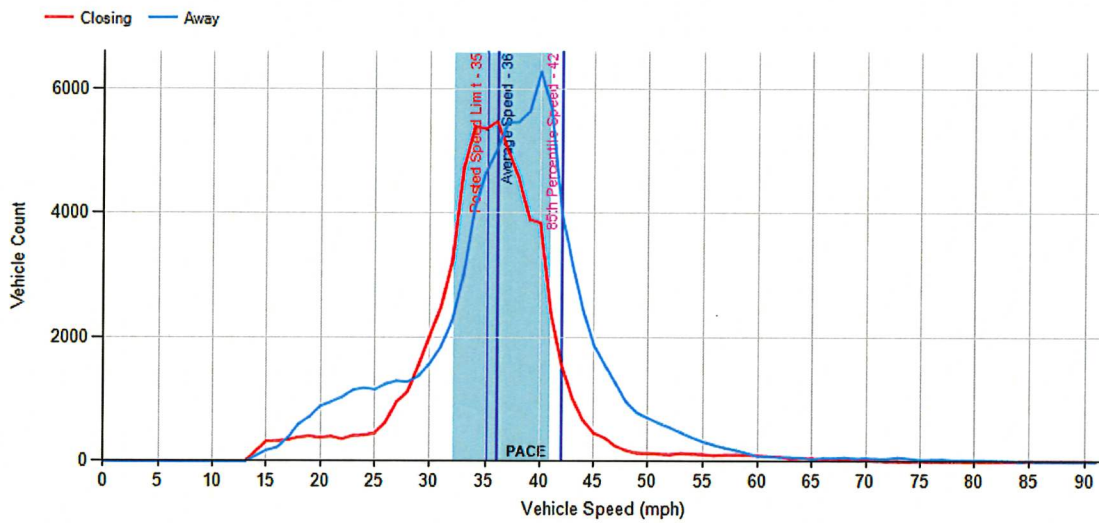

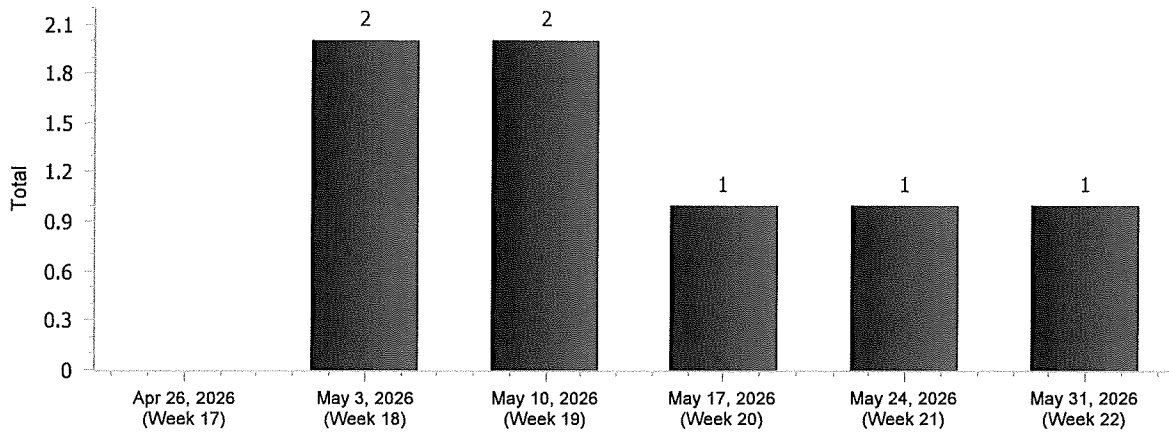

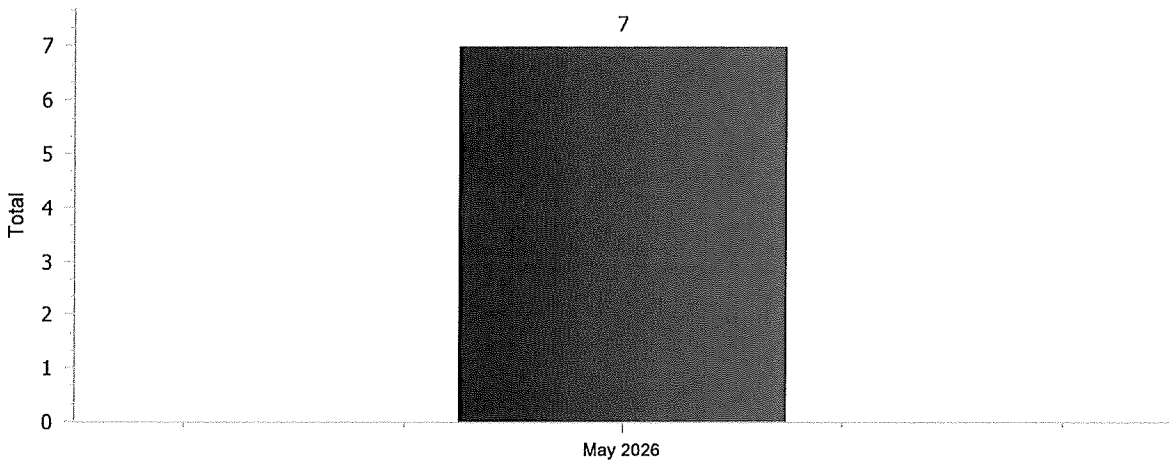

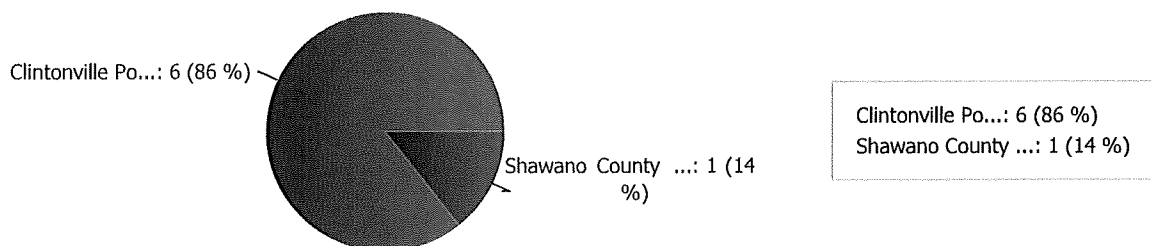

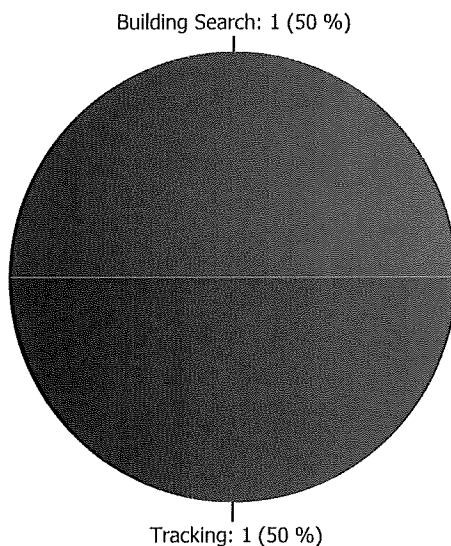

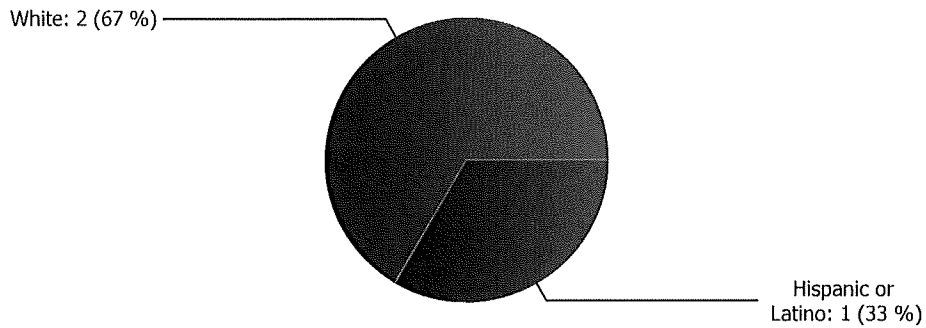

Demographic Data: Arrests

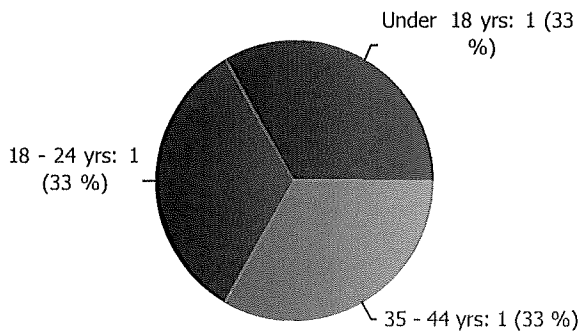
Arrests by Race/Ethnicity

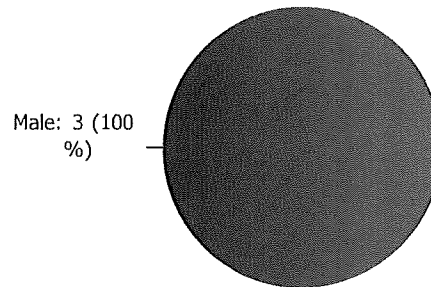
Arrests by Age

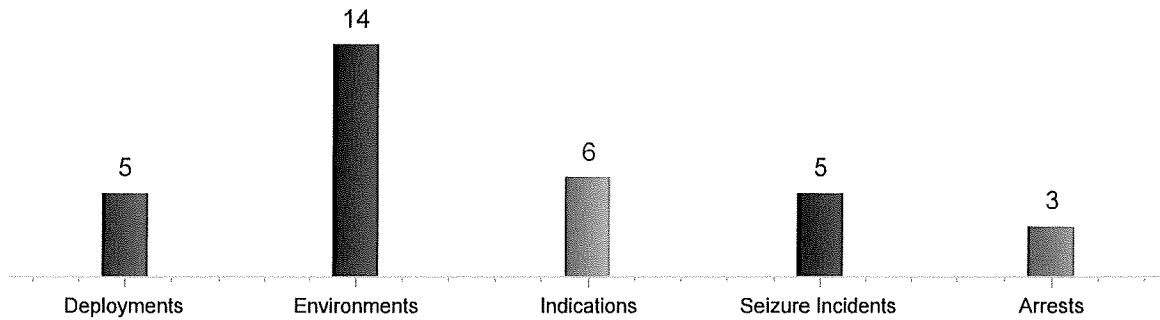

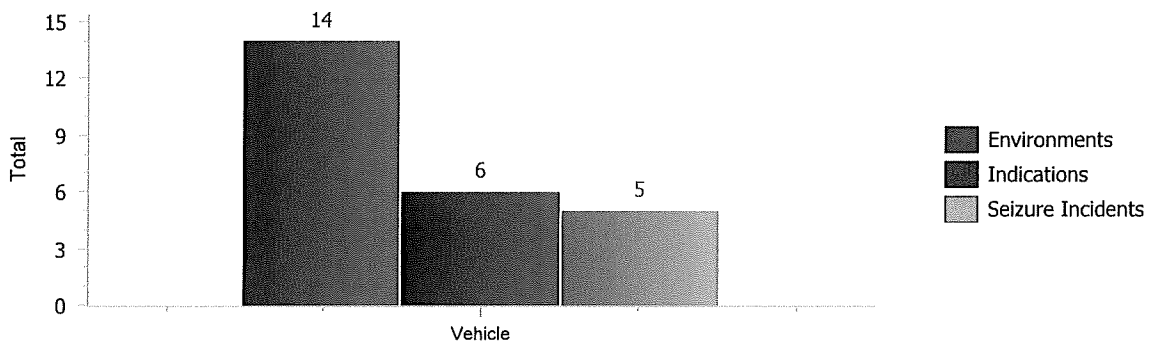

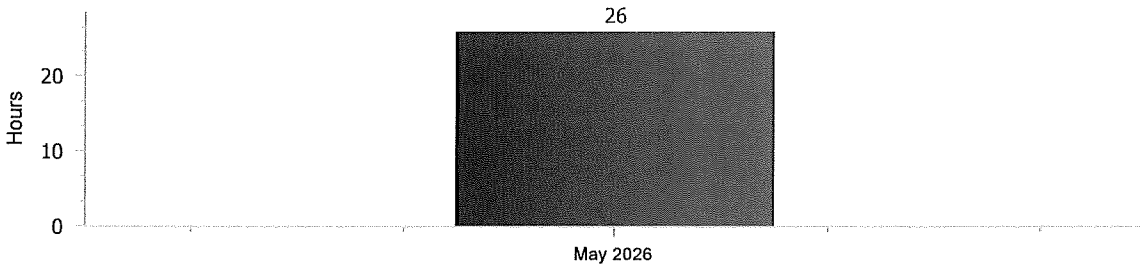
Training By Day Of Week

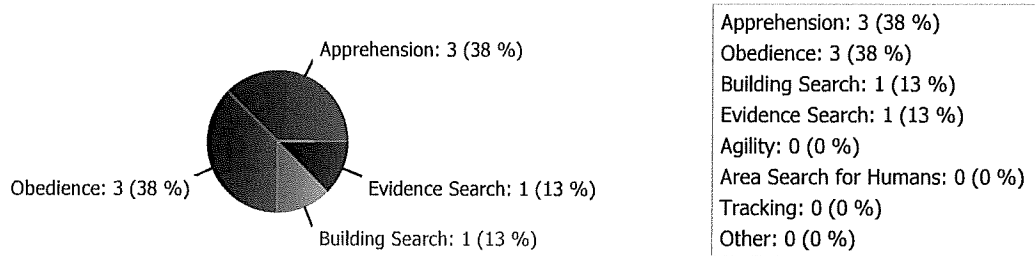

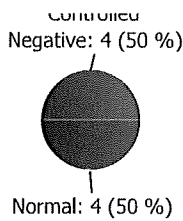

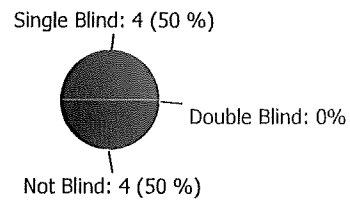
Patrol Exercise Types



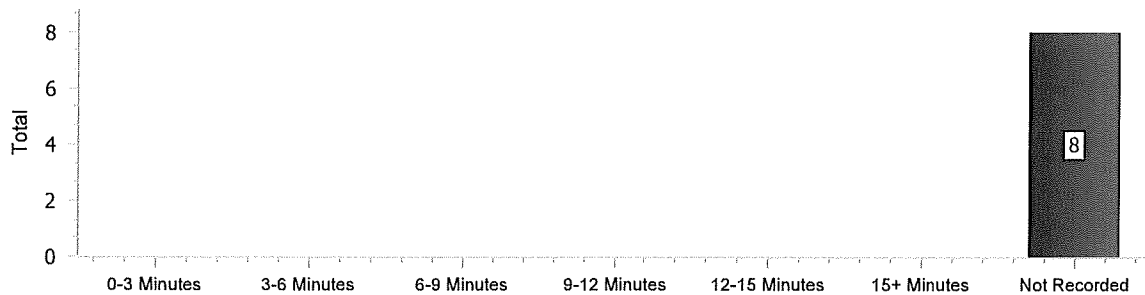
Controlled Negative Detection Exercises

Detection Exercise Lengths

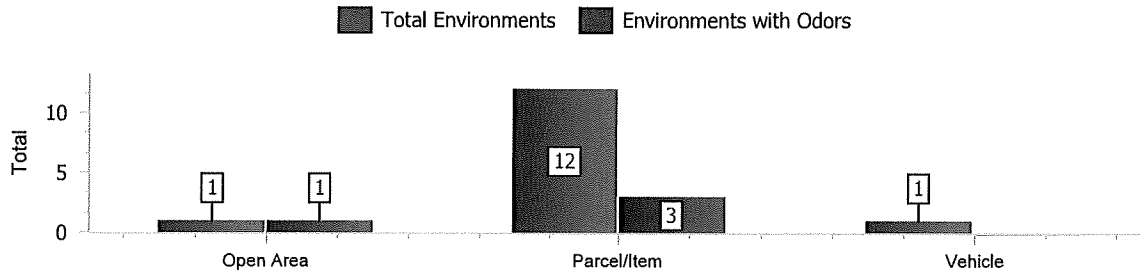
