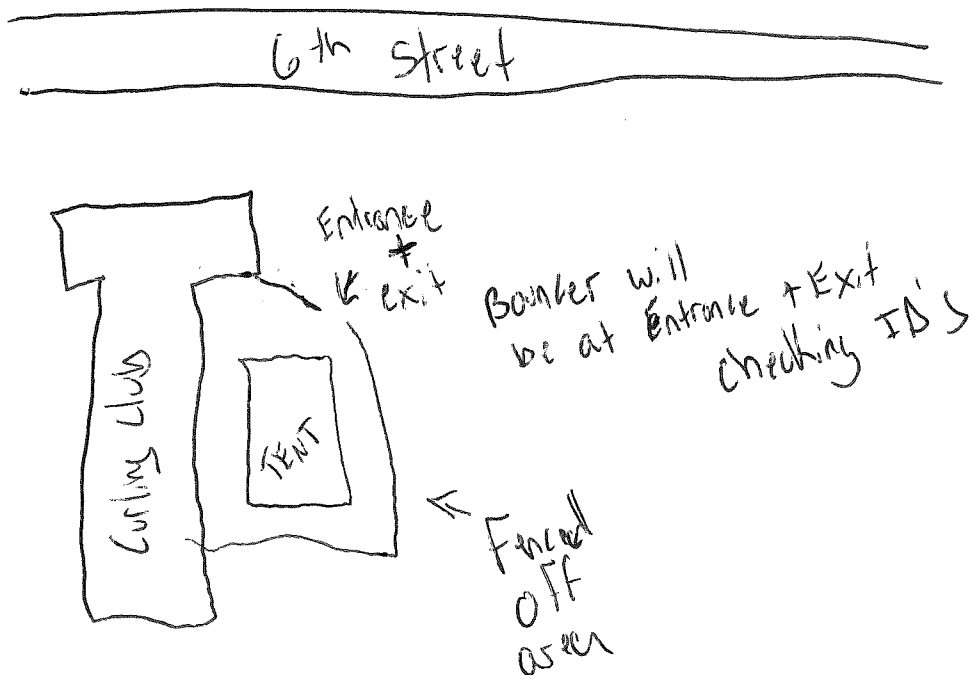

RE: City Administrator's Report

It's been a very busy, but productive month introducing myself to the community.

2027 get Development

- The City's Final 2026 Net New Construction is 0.669%, while Waupaca County's is 1.12%. WI Dept. of Revenue will release the Levy Limit Worksheet tomorrow, which will allow us to calculate the increase to the levy limit for the City in 2027. State Shared Revenues scheduled for release Sep. 14.
- Departments will be reviewing the City's Fee Schedule and submitting proposed changes later this month.
- Departments will be submitting any proposed Table of Organization changes later this month.
- Met with the City's financial advisor, Ehlers, to discuss the Expenditure Restraint Program, the City's Financial Management Plan, and the City's TID's.
- Met with City's HR consultant, Cottingham & Butler, to discuss the wage study implementation, employee benefits, open enrollment, and training services they provide.

Economic Development

- Met with Waupaca Economic Development Corporation Director Jeff Mikorski to discuss several potential economic development initiatives, including a possible expansion of several local businesses and relocation of a Corporate Headquarters to Clintonville.
- Met with the City's financial advisor, Ehlers, to discuss the City's existing TID's and have preliminary discussions on the possibility of adding TID's related to the economic development projects identified above.
- Attended Onward Clintonville's monthly meeting and offered to be a resource for the group regarding assistance the City can provide towards downtown revitalization efforts moving forward.
- Spoke with a party interested in the Clintonville Airport for an aviation maintenance and repair business, who attended the Airport Committee meeting and submitted a business plan to the City. Will be following up with him this week.
- Met with Joe O'Connor regarding various real estate issues and the Clintonville Industrial Development Corporation
- Met with Brad Rokus regarding the Redevelopment Authority's role in economic development

Housing

- Preliminary discussions with a housing developer regarding their interest in Clintonville for a new housing development.
- Met with a local developer who has previously built units in Clintonville to discuss possible City incentives to expand their work.
- Evaluating creative incentive programs the City could offer to increase housing development in Clintonville.

Citizens Forum: Leah Wojnowiak, a resident of Clintonville, spoke regarding the child safe residence waiver.

Approval of Minutes: Hanson/Rose m/s/c to approve minutes from July 6, 2026

BP Bar License: The licensee, Clinton Gas, Inc, with their attorney Ty Willihnganz, agreed to withdraw their appeal and the City agreed to recommend a renewal of the subject license on the following terms, which shall be specific terms upon the license:

- A. The subject premises must be open at least 25 hours each week.
- B. A schedule shall be provided to the City attorney of open hours.
- C. The license holder shall each month provide a written certification of the hours that the establishment is open.
- D. The establishment shall follow all rules and regulations, as well as this agreement. Any violation shall result in an immediate suspension of the license. Such rules shall include that there shall be no living quarters of any sort in the subject premise.

Supanich/Rose m/s/c to recommend to the Common Council approval of the beer license agreement as per Steckbauer. Roll call 3-1 (No-Hansen)

Child Safe Residence Waiver: Supanich/Rose m/s/c to open the public hearing for the child safe residence waiver. The resident did not appear, and he was deemed to be in default. 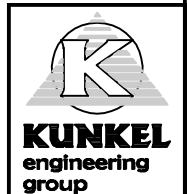

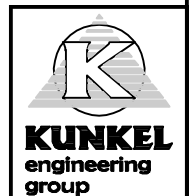

Pigeon River Pedestrian Bridge Replacements
Feasibility and Estimated Costs

Situation:

Two pedestrian bridges crossing the Pidgeon River were damaged during the flooding in April of 2026 and are currently considered unsafe for use by the public. Although both of the bridge decks are intact there was considerable erosion damage at the abutments leaving the approaches undermined. The city must decide to either remove the bridges or rebuild/rehabilitate the structures.

Permitting:

Wisconsin Code Trans 207 covers Municipal Bridges however it is not in our opinion applicable to pedestrian bridges. Our previous work with pedestrian bridges over waterways considered navigable was done under the coverage of WDNR General Permit GP2-2022. This process involves a submittal showing that the work falls in compliance with the code provisions.

Bridges:

- The Main Street pedestrian bridge is located 150 ft upstream or NW of the Main Street Bridge and 300 ft downstream of the dam. This is a single 8 ft wide 48 ft long concrete span, with a narrower fenced walkway, running from a ramped abutment on the SW side to a retaining wall on the NE side. The location is a narrow, channelized section of the waterway near the dam and has rapid and turbulent flow during high water. The deck elevation is significantly below the base flood profile which would produce a significant lateral load on the structure. During the recent flooding in April the deck was over-topped and the abutments suffered serious erosion, with the most extensive being on the NW side.
- The Olen Park pedestrian bridge is located 140 ft downstream of the Memorial Circle Bridge. This is a 55 ft long two span steel truss bridge with a 6 ft wide steel deck. The bridge plate indicates a 1908 date of construction. The deck appears to be below the base flood profile. The recent flooding in April displaced the spans on their supports and the abutments suffered damage with erosion at the bridge seats.

Understandably the City would like to salvage and reuse the historic steel truss structure, however I see serious problems with this undertaking. Lifting and resetting the superstructure would produce an unbalanced set of stresses on the 118-year-old structure, that could compromise the weathered connections on the trusses. One possibility, would be to have a structural safety assessment done, then to jack up the superstructure in place near the current load bearing areas, repair the abutments and bearing seats, and then lower the superstructure into position. Feasibility of this approach for this situation would have to be made by a bridge construction firm with considerable experience in this type of rehabilitation.

The attached preliminary cost estimates are prepared to provide costs to:

- 1) Remove the bridges with in kind site restoration, and route pedestrian traffic to nearby city street bridge crossings.
- 2) Repair the abutments and approaches and replace the bridges with new steel bridges having a poured concrete deck.

For purposes of the attached estimate, the replacement bridge type considered is a prefabricated steel span bridge with 6 ft wide galvanized form decking for 5" field poured concrete deck, as furnished by Continental or a similar manufacturer/supplier. This would be an AISC (American Institute of Steel Construction) design for an 85 psf live load and 4000 lb vehicle load. We feel that use of a FRP or Wood deck would not be appropriate for this situation due to flooding potential. The deck would be provided with steel rails, toe plate, wooden rub rail and cover plates at the ends.

A precast concrete bridge span can be considered for replacement of the Main Street pedestrian bridge however this would not be a standard item and would require a more in-depth investigation to prepare a memo of feasibility and estimated costs.

Chair's Report for Annual Meeting. August 26, 2026

I'll keep my report fairly brief, since we'll be hearing from others of you about the progress of your Committees.

It's been a decent year for the Pigeon Lake Protection and Rehabilitation District. We continue to grow trust in the public by saying what we're going to do, doing it, and then not being shy about telling people about what we did. We've continued to have strong relationships with the City of Clintonville, Township of Larrabee, Waupaca County, and the Wisconsin DNR, but there are still too many in our community who don't know about us and our work—but who might be willing to work with us, if they did.

We've navigated a good bit of turn-over on the Board over the past two years—which has been a good and necessary thing, but also has brought some challenges. We're still getting to know our collective strengths and weaknesses—but I honestly enjoy working with each one of you, and I'm committed to seeing our mutual work flourish and grow.

We've made progress on each of the five goals in our Lake Management Plan:

- 1) **Assure Navigational Access on Pigeon Lake:** We continue to operate the weed harvester, and we have not had to use any herbicides to control aquatic invasive species on Pigeon Lake. The upcoming AIS survey being done for us by Wisconsin Lakes and Ponds should give us more insight and information to make science-guided decisions about how to have enough weeds for a healthy fishery, but not too many to impede navigation. We are committed to working with area riparian owners to ensure access to their docks, insofar as we can do so safely. The upcoming bathymetric mapping of the lake depth should also give us a very important range of data to work with. We'll be able to see what the recent flooding changed in the lake bed, along with other changes over time, and that will help us to clarify the areas where potential dredging would be most beneficial, if found to be feasible and permitted by the DNR. It is the possibility of small-scale dredging that could be a very large ticket item in our future budgets, and is the primary driver for the very

slight increase in the tax levy that we are requesting for this year (the first increase in six years).

2) **Enhance Pigeon Lake District's Capacity to Interact with and Inform its**

Members: Heather Ripp has been simply excellent in her role doing marketing for us, and the Communications Committee has improved the regularity and consistency of our communication with various constituencies. Having a physical office downtown is a real plus for us, as is having Trish Dawson in her role as "Special Projects Coordinator." Trish has been simply fabulous. We've continued to participate in community events to "get our name out there," as we will again during Fall Frenzy (coming up soon!), and we've sponsored some of our own successful events to grow community engagement—and are planning to do some more. We had a team attend the Wisconsin Lakes and Rivers Convention again this year—which is always a great opportunity to learn. I highly recommended attending, especially for newer Board members.

3) **Maximize Pigeon Lake Fishery** As mentioned, we've had an open line of communication with WDNR fisheries staff (led by some hard work by Trish), and they've been helpful in guiding our decisions regarding proper stocking and in carp control efforts—which will continue and accelerate next year. The lake could still use more coarse woody habitat additions—fish sticks, so we should commit to working with the City and Larrabee on installing some more of them, as labor and other resources permit.

4) **Reduce Nutrient and Sediment Pollution Originating from Pigeon Lake**

Watershed Taylor Hasz from Waupaca County continues to implement the testing and other elements of the \$600K Targeted Runoff Management Grant that was received for the watershed from the Federal Government. Those funds have assisted farmers to plant 356 acres of cover crops, create 3 roof runoff structures, and put 520.4 acres of land into no-till residue management. Taylor also reported that she has completed (as of last Monday!) the 9 Key Elements Plan for the Pigeon Lake watershed (which may open up other State and Federal grants for us). That 9KE plan was developed out of a National Water Quality Initiative Plan that Taylor and the County developed in partnership with the Natural Resource Conservation Service, and that was approved in March. Through our good relationships with the DNR and the County, we've made real progress on reducing sediment runoff into Pigeon Lake—and I hope that continues and expands in the coming years.

5) **Develop and Maintain a Long-Term Environmental Monitoring Program on**

Pigeon Lake It's crucial to know what's happening with the chemistry of our water if we want to know how best to keep it as clean as possible. We're fortunate in that the refresh rate on Pigeon Lake is about 3.5 days—which is remarkably fast. That helps

keep the water clean—so long as we don't have problems entering upstream!
Although we were not invited to participate in the DNR Citizens Monitoring Program for this year (it rotates across Lake Districts and Associations), we did contract for testing to begin giving us the kind of longitudinal data that will help us make wise decisions about actions to protect and improve the water quality in Pigeon Lake.

I look forward to hearing the rest of our reports, and I thank each of you, again, for your willingness to serve our community and to care for this wonderful natural ecosystem that benefits all of us.

JAMIE HEIN, LIBRARY DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

National Games & Libraries Fellowship

I applied and was selected to be a part of the National Games & Libraries Fellowship. This project is a partnership between the Bureau of Libraries of the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, Field Day, the Washington State Library, WiLS, foundry10, and the Wisconsin Center for Education Research with funding provided by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS). The purpose of the project is to develop recommendations and best practices related to implementing games-based collections and programs in libraries. The fellowship started with a one-day, in-person kick-off workshop at UW-Madison on Wednesday, July 8. There will be three virtual follow-up meetings between now and Summer 2027 where fellows will be planning, implementing, and reporting on one or more games-based programs, collections, and/or initiatives in our libraries. I'm one of eight librarians from Wisconsin selected to be a part of this national project, along with four librarians from Washington state.

AAC Meeting

I attended the OWLSnet Automation Advisory Committee (AAC) meeting on July 10. The majority of the discussion revolved around the dates related to the migration.

- On August 7th, we held our annual golf outing, and yet again it was a big success. Every year we try to make the event bigger and better, and it's becoming difficult to top the previous years, but we have made it happen. Planning for our golf outing begins several months before the event. Staff members devote many hours to plan and organize the outing. We have been able to make it successful because of the dedicated staff, our generous businesses, and community members. We are looking forward to next year's golf outing.
- On September 1st, we had an officer struck by a motor vehicle. Due to the early stages of the investigation, I can't divulge much information, and because our officer is involved, we are not involved in the investigation. The Waupaca County Sheriff's Office was asked to be the investigating agency, along with the Wisconsin State Patrol. We cannot thank them enough for their assistance. We would also like to thank the Clintonville Area Ambulance Service and Clintonville Fire Department for their response and the professionalism they displayed.
- On September 1st Sgt. Andy Arrieta officially began his duties as a patrol sergeant. Andy is a veteran officer in our department and will do well as a leader. Andy will be assigned to the daytime patrol sergeant position.
- We were able to fill our vacant crossing guard position with Donna Frederick. We are very excited to have her as a crossing guard, and we are confident she will do well.
- In August, we had a higher-than-average number of criminal arrests for the month. We saw an increase in welfare checks/mental health complaints. These types of calls can take anywhere from 20 minutes to 4 to 6 hours.
- Our new squad car, which was budgeted through the capital budget, is now in service, and we will surplus the squad car that was taken out of rotation.
- You will see a memo attached to this month's report. This memo was drafted by Officer Rollin, who is our K-9 handler. The memo will provide you with a snapshot of the work he and K-9 Thor have accomplished over nearly four years of service to our community. Officer Rollin has exceeded our expectations as a K-9 handler. Thor's performance is a reflection of the time Officer Rollin has invested in training with him.

The Clintonville Police Department K9 Program is a donation-based program and is not comprised by tax paying dollars. Our current K9 is Thor. Thor is a dual-purpose German Shepherd. On May 27, 2022, K9 Thor then made his way to Iron Ridge, Wisconsin, and arrived at Jessiffany Canine Service, which specializes in training police K9s. Once K9 Thor was personally selected by the Clintonville Police Department, a five-week training course ensued with Thor and his handler. During the five-week Police K9 course, Thor was trained in Tracking, Article Searches, Criminal Apprehension, Officer Protection, and Narcotics. K9 Thor is trained in the detection of Marijuana, Methamphetamine, Heroin, Cocaine, and MDMA (Ecstasy). After the five-week course, Thor passed all the State of Wisconsin certification requirements and began his first patrol shift in early October of 2022. Thor must maintain 16 hours of training a month per state requirements, along with yearly certification.

As of September 1st, 2026 Thor has logged 848.5 hours of training and 252 deployments. With the 252 deployments conducted by Thor, it has resulted in 108 arrests, 311 drug paraphernalia seized, 1.302 kilograms of marijuana products, 153.03 grams of methamphetamine, 3.94 grams of fentanyl, 22.32 grams of cocaine, 43.29 grams of ecstasy, and 4 firearms. One firearm was located on a traffic stop after conducting a free air sniff with K9 Thor. The firearm was possessed by a convicted felon. The three other firearms were located after it had been reported that they had been stolen. Thor was utilized for an evidence search, that he is trained in, and located the firearms where they had been hidden on a nearby property.

The K9 Program continues to protect the community and surrounding communities in its efforts to seize illegal contraband, locate missing individuals, and apprehend criminals.

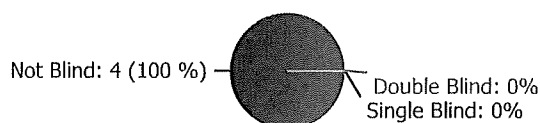
Patrol Exercise Types



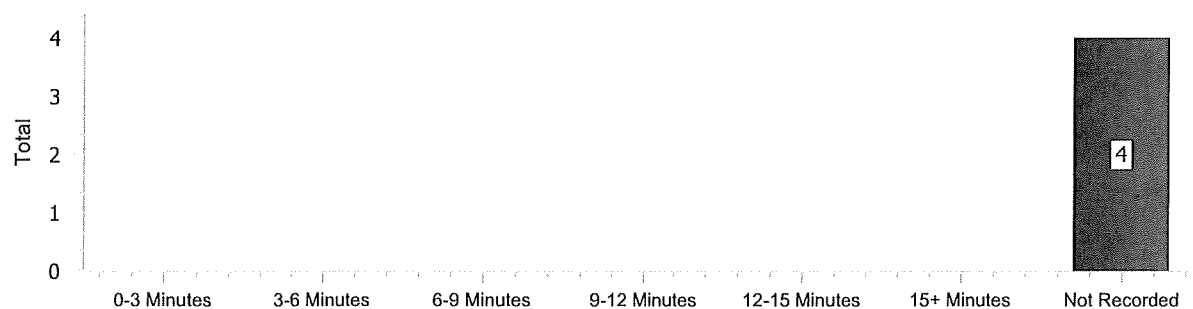
